On the pretty faces of those especially who are trying to have a continuous good time, one sees very often a kind of bored sullenness (bad temper) that ruins all their charm. But the sullen boredom of which I have spoken was so deeply stamped into their fresh faces, their gait (way of walking) and gestures so weary (tired or fatigued) a listlessness (weakness and slowness), that it was unbearable to look at them. These exquisite (extremely beautiful) creatures were positively repulsive (definitely horrible to look at).
